The Exhibit-Proposed document types are used to submit or present exhibits to the court for consideration. When admitted, Exhibit-Submissions are automatically converted to Exhibits by the court.

**Note: Exhibits and Attachments.** Before electronic filing was implemented in lowa, all supporting materials were called "exhibits".

Now, the term "exhibit" is reserved for evidence entered into the record at a hearing or trial. Supporting materials attached to an application, motion, court form, or verification of account, etc. are called "attachments".

See the Comment to Rule 16.311 for additional explanation and examples of the use of attachments.

Exhibits should be prepared prior to submitting. See Preparing Documents.

**Note:** If your exhibit exceeds the file size limit (20 MB District/150 MB Appellate), break it into smaller documents, then submit each part separately.

## Finding your case

1. Click Existing Case.



- 2. Select the appropriate County.
- 3. Enter the Case Number.
- 4. Enter the Participant's Last Name.
- 5. Click **File on this case**. Cases in which you are an active party will display at the bottom the Existing Case screen.



## Filing your exhibit

- In the Document Type field, select EXHIBIT -PROPOSED.
- 2. Click Browse.
- Browse to your prepared exhibit and select it.
- 4. Click Add.



The Exhibit Submission Screen will display.


- Enter an exhibit number. Each exhibit number must be unique (cannot be used more than once).
- 6. Enter an Exhibit Description.
- 7. Click Next.



**Note:** If you broke a large exhibit into smaller documents, repeat these steps to submit each part of the exhibit. For each separate submission, give the exhibit a different but related exhibit number, for example 16A, 16B, 16c, etc. Indicate that your exhibit is filed in separate submissions by adding a note under Special Filing Instructions to the Clerk (see Step 11, below).

8. Click the blue file name in the View Document column. Review the document to verify that it loaded properly.

## 9. Click Next.




**Note:** If you need to modify the Exhibit Number or Description, click the document icon in the Edit Data column.

- On the Review and Approve Filling page, verify all information being submitted on the case is accurate and complete.
- 11. Optional. Add special filing instructions for the clerk. For example, explain that your exhibit is broken into separate submissions because of size.
- 12. Click Submit the Filing.

The document will be named Exhibit-Proposed. When it has been admitted by the court, it will be renamed as Exhibit, and saved in the Case History.

You will receive a confirmation and a status update in the My Filings list. For more information, see <u>Managing Filings</u>, <u>Cases</u>, and <u>Notifications</u>.



To view exhibits that have been offered into evidence and admitted on your case, click **My Cases**.

Juvenile exhibits admitted will display as Exhibit-Juvenile (#1), (#2), etc. On all other case types, they will display as Exhibit (#1), (#2), etc.
