**In the Matter of the Uniform Bond  
Schedule Promulgated by the  
Judicial Council****Order**

Pursuant to Iowa Code section 804.21(5), the Judicial Council has conducted a periodic review of the Uniform Bond Schedule and finds that no change from the current bond schedule, as set forth in the June 23, 2017 court order, is necessary. All provisions of the court's June 23, 2017 court order remain in effect.

The uniform bond amounts set forth in the June 23, 2017 court order for the release of a person arrested for a crime when the courts are not in session are as follows:

- Any class "B" felony—\$25,000.
- Any class "C" felony—\$10,000.
- Any class "D" felony—\$5,000.
- Aggravated misdemeanor—\$2,000.
- Serious misdemeanor—\$1,000.
- Simple misdemeanor—\$300.
- Traffic and other scheduled violations of Iowa Code sections 805.6 through 805.16—amount set forth in the State of Iowa Compendium of Scheduled Violations and Scheduled Fines.


Additionally, as set forth in the June 23, 2017 court order, bond may not be set for persons arrested for the following crimes until they have been seen by a judicial officer:

- Forcible felony crimes, as defined in Iowa Code section 702.11.
- Manufacture, delivery, possession with intent to manufacture or deliver, or distribution of methamphetamine under Iowa Code section 124.401, as provided for in Iowa Code section 804.21(1).
- Stalking, pursuant to Iowa Code section 708.11(5).
- Persons arrested or taken into custody pursuant to any of the following Iowa Code sections: 236.11, 236.12, 236A.12, and 664A.3.

- Persons arrested or taken into custody pursuant to Iowa Code sections 236.11 or 236.12.
- Persons arrested or taken into custody for intimidation with a dangerous weapon in violation of Iowa Code section 708.6.
- Persons arrested or taken into custody for possession of a firearm by a felon in violation of Iowa Code section 724.26(1).
