

In the Iowa Supreme Court

**In the Matter of the Uniform
Bond Schedule Promulgated by
the Judicial Council****Order**

Pursuant to Iowa Code section 804.21(5), the Judicial Council has conducted a periodic review of the Uniform Bond Schedule and finds that the only necessary change from the current bond schedule, as set forth in the September 1, 2021 court order, is to incorporate the legislative directive contained in H.F. 2079 (eff. July 1, 2022), which adds certain specified offenses that require an appearance before a magistrate before a person can be released on bail. All remaining provisions of the court's September 1, 2021 order remain in effect.

The following uniform bond amounts for the release of a person arrested for a crime when the courts are not session, as set forth in the September 1, 2021 court order, remain in effect:

- Any class "B" felony—\$25,000.
- Any class "C" felony—\$10,000.
- Any class "D" felony—\$5,000.
- Aggravated misdemeanor—\$2,000.
- Serious misdemeanor—\$1,000.
- Simple misdemeanor—\$300.
- Traffic and other scheduled violations of Iowa Code sections 805.6 through 805.16—amount set forth in the State of Iowa Compendium of Scheduled Violations and Scheduled Fines.


Additionally, as set forth in the September 1, 2021 court order, and as required by H.F. 2079 (eff. July 1, 2022), bond may not be set for persons arrested for the following crimes until they have been seen by a judicial officer:

- Forcible felony crimes, as defined in Iowa Code section 702.11.
- Manufacture, delivery, possession with intent to manufacture or deliver, or distribution of methamphetamine under Iowa Code section 124.401, as provided in Iowa Code section 804.2(1).
- Stalking, pursuant to Iowa Code section 708.11(5).

- Persons arrested or taken into custody pursuant to any of the following Iowa Code sections: 236.11, 236.12, 236A.12, and 664A.3.
- Persons arrested or taken into custody for intimidation with a dangerous weapon in violation of Iowa Code section 708.6.
- Persons arrested pursuant to Iowa Code section 709.2, 709.3 or 709.4.
- Persons arrested or taken into custody for possession of a firearm by a felon in violation of Iowa Code section 724.26(1).
